## Key Stage 3 Assessment Weeks - Term 1

Next half term sees the start of formal assessments within the majority of subject areas. These assessments are extremely important, as they will provide teachers with an insight into individual student's knowledge and their understanding on a range of specified topics.

Written assessments will be completed in a normal classroom environment within a 50-minute lesson.

Most written assessments will be following the same structure of: -

Retrieval Topics (10 marks)	<ul> <li>to help assess students' long-term memory and may be based on key knowledge that was taught during the last academic year.</li> </ul>
Key Knowledge Topics (10 marks)	- to assess some topics that students have been taught this term.
Application of Key Knowledge Topics (30 marks)	<ul> <li>to assess how students apply the key knowledge learnt. For example, this could be a question in context, a multi-step question or could be a longer written response.</li> </ul>

Individual departments will be supporting and providing resources to help students prepare for the assessments. These will be both in class and posted as home learning on Satchel One.

Topic lists will be provided to all students, parents and carers to support their revision.

#### Uniform

Again, thank you for your continued efforts in making sure our students have had the correct uniform, especially during a time when all families are experiencing added financial pressures due to the increase in costs of living. Your collective efforts are very much appreciated. We have several preloved items of uniform available free for families. Please contact the academy for further details should you need any additional support.

Winter appears to have arrived and I would encourage students to bring outdoor coats / waterproof coats during this period. Please note as per policy, hoodies or hooded jumpers should not be worn as coats, and students will be asked to remove these and, or they will be stored for safe keeping if they arrive or continue to arrive wearing them to the academy.

Uniform is very important to us, as it helps to establish the right attitude to learning and behaviour, which we pride ourselves on here at South Axholme Academy. Students learn about appropriate dress code preparing them for the world of work. It also helps them to understand how, when wearing a uniform, they become a representative of the logo they are displaying. Finally, there is also a safeguarding element with staff able to identify our students when entering or leaving the academy.

#### **Attendance**

At South Axholme Academy, excellent attendance and punctuality is our aim for every child. We set an attendance target of 100% as the minimum that we expect for all students.

Evidence shows that those children who attend school regularly make better progress academically and socially. To help a child achieve full attendance, parents and carers play a critical role in helping us promote good attitudes towards attendance.

Together, it is important that we ensure children are present at every opportunity, arriving on time, and not being taken out of the academy without authorisation. A child's attendance is monitored closely, and we will follow up unexplained absences with parents or carers.

Our attendance this half term has once again been excellent, and I thank you for your continued support.

### Leave of Absence Requests – reminder

Amendments came into force in September 2013 and the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006 now state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Please note that absence will not be authorised for reasons such as, birthdays, day trips, weekends away, shift patterns, holidays etc.

Only exceptional circumstances warrant an authorised leave of absence.

Requests should be made in writing to the attendance team well in advance by parents or carers.

Requests for absence for reasons such as compassionate leave, special family events, sporting or musical competitions, etc. should be made in the same way.

All requests are considered individually, taking into account the circumstances of the request. Other factors will be taken into account, such as:

- the time of year the child will be absent
- the attendance record of the child
- the number of previous requests for leave of absence

We will notify parents of our decision either by telephone or in writing.

Where a parental request has been refused, and parents continue to take their child out of school, this absence will be recorded as unauthorised. We reserve the right to apply to the Local Authority to issue a Fixed Penalty Notice under the Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003.

Where a child's attendance record reaches a concerning level, we will contact the child's parents or carers to discuss ways in which we can support all parties to help improve the child's attendance.
