

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

Absence from School

If your child is ill, please let the academy know as soon as possible on the first morning of absence and on every morning throughout the absence. We operate a 'first contact' system and will text/call you if we have not heard why your child is absent.


LEAVE OF ABSENCE

The Principal has the discretion to grant a Leave of Absence during term time, but only under exceptional circumstances.

As a guide, exceptional circumstances are considered to be those which are unlikely to happen again during the time that a child is at the academy.

In such circumstances a leave of absence form must be completed, giving details and supporting evidence, prior to the absence and at least 10 working days before the required leave.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS



MAXIMISE YOUR POTENTIAL. ATTEND SCHOOL EVERY DAY.

RETROSPECTIVE CONSENT WILL NOT BE GIVEN

An application for leave of absence can be obtained from reception or via our website. Any absence taken without the permission of the Principal will be recorded as unauthorised on the Academy register, which is a legal document.

Penalty Notices will be issued under section 23 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003 as an alternative to prosecution, for failing to ensure your child's regular attendance at the academy. For repeat offences where the Penalty Notice is not acting as a deterrent, the Local Authority may move to a formal legal intervention - Section 444(1) of the Education Act 1996 states that if a child of compulsory school age, who is a registered pupil at a school fails to attend regular at the school, their parent/carer is guilty of an offence.

Should any parent/carer be found guilty, sanctions can include a fine up to £1,000. Repeat offences may incur a much higher sanction under Section 44(1A) of the Education Act 1996 up to £2500.



Dear parents, carers and guardians,

Uptake levels of childhood vaccines offered through the routine NHS vaccination programme in England have been falling over the past decade across all vaccines, including whooping cough, measles, mumps and rubella, polio, meningitis and diphtheria - with England no longer having the levels of population immunity recommended by the World Health Organization that is needed to prevent outbreaks.

Nationally we are seeing an increase in cases of measles and pertussis (whooping cough) and parents or guardians are being urged to have their children vaccinated in accordance with the childhood vaccination schedule.

Health leaders in North Lincolnshire are backing a major new campaign to remind parents and carers of the risk of their children missing out on protection against serious diseases – with an urgent call to action to catch up on missed vaccinations.

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) campaign has released a <u>powerful video</u> advert told from the perspective of children and in their voices.

About measles and the MMR vaccine

Measles is a highly infectious, serious illness that can be very unpleasant. Those most at risk are under ones, the unvaccinated, immuno-compromised or pregnant woman. There is no specific treatment available, so it is important to get vaccinated to avoid serious illness.

Following the measles outbreaks in London and the West Midlands, the UKHSA are urging parents and guardians of children who are not up to date with their two doses of MMR vaccine to contact their GP practice to book an appointment. If you are unsure of a vaccination status you should consult the red book or contact your GP practice. It's never too late to catch up as the best protection against measles for children and adults is to get both doses of the MMR vaccine.

The MMR vaccine is the safest and most effective way for parents to protect their children against measles, mumps and rubella. If you and your child have been vaccinated, it's very unlikely you will catch measles.

If anyone in your family is diagnosed with measles it is important they stay home and do not go into work, school or nursery whilst they are likely to be infectious (from 4 days before rash onset and for a further 4 full days). Cases should only return to work, school or nursery when they have fully recovered from measles.

MEASLES IS CIRCULATING

With one in five children needing a hospital visit, measles is very infectious and can lead to serious complications; especially for those with weakened immune systems, babies under 1 year of age and pregnant women.

Pertussis

(Whooping Cough)

Whooping cough (pertussis) is a bacterial infection of the lungs and breathing tubes. It spreads very easily and can sometimes cause serious problems. It's important for babies and children to get vaccinated against it.

Whooping cough can affect people of all ages but for very young infants, it can be particularly serious. However, vaccinating pregnant women is highly effective in protecting babies from birth until they can receive their own vaccines. Parents can also help protect their children by ensuring they receive their vaccines at the right time or catching up as soon as possible if they have missed any. If you're unsure, please check your child's red book or get in touch with your GP surgery.

The whooping cough vaccine is the safest and most effective way for parents to protect their children against whooping cough. However, the whooping cough vaccine is not routinely recommended for those aged 10 years and over, apart from pregnant women or as part of outbreak control.

UKHSA advise a pertussis-containing vaccine can be considered as a post exposure measure for those aged more than 10 years old who have had close contact with suspected or confirmed cases of pertussis.

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

The first signs of whooping cough are similar to a <u>cold</u>, such as a runny nose and sore throat (a high temperature is uncommon).

After about a week, you or your child:

- will get coughing bouts that last for a few minutes and are worse at night
- may make a "whoop" sound a gasp for breath between coughs (young babies and some adults may not "whoop")
- may have difficulty breathing after a coughing bout and may turn blue or grey (young infants)
- may bring up a thick mucus, which can make you vomit
- may become very red in the face (more common in adults)

The cough may last for several weeks or months.

GET VACCINATED

Routine vaccinations are offered for free on the NHS to all babies and children and millions of doses have been given safely in the UK and around the world. All vaccines are thoroughly tested for safety and are continually monitored after they are introduced.

Parents or guardians of children who are not up to date with their whooping cough vaccine should contact their GP practice to book an appointment.
