

South Axholme Academy celebrates another year of outstanding GCSE results



Students and staff at South Axholme Academy, part of Isle Education Trust, are celebrating another year of outstanding GCSE results, with achievement and progress continuing to be significantly above national averages.

The academy has once again secured its place as one of the highest-performing schools in North Lincolnshire, with outcomes in both English and mathematics exceeding national averages by 5% across all key measures. Excellent results were achieved across the curriculum, reflecting the hard work, resilience and ambition of students, alongside the dedication and expertise of academy staff.

Particularly strong performances were seen in Art and Design, where 36% of students achieved grades 9-7 and 72% secured grade 5 or above. Food Technology also delivered excellent outcomes, with 30% achieving grades 9-7 and 77% gaining grade 5 or above. In Construction and the Built Environment, 91% of students achieved a grade 4 or above, while Religious Education, Sport Science and all Triple Science subjects also performed significantly above national averages.

Stephanie Hamilton, Principal of South Axholme Academy, said:

"We are incredibly proud of all of our students and the determination they have shown throughout their time at the academy. These results are a reflection of their hard work and resilience, as well as the unwavering support of our staff and families.

This is a particularly special moment for me as my first year as Principal. I am proud to see the academy continuing its strong tradition of success and maintaining its position as one of the top-performing schools in North Lincolnshire."

The academy was also delighted to see several exceptional individual performances.

Beth Lewis was the year group's highest achiever, securing an outstanding 6 grade 9s, 2 grade 8s and 1 grade 7.

Among the other top performers were Adam Crossfield, who achieved 5 grade 9s, 2 Distinction Stars and 1 grade 7; Emily Green, who secured 5 grade 9s and 4 grade 8s; and Lucia Verrico, who achieved 5 grade 9s, 2 grade 8s and 2 grade 7s.

There were also exceptional performances from Will Hoey and Amelia Moore, who between them achieved an impressive 6 grade 9s, 9 grade 8s and 3 grade 7s.

The students who made the most progress from their starting points, achieving on average more than three grades above expectation, were Toby Brotzel, Will Gorsen and Anna Tillman.

As students collected their results, there were plenty of smiles, celebrations and proud moments as they prepared for the next stage of their education. Many will progress to sixth form, college, apprenticeships and other exciting post-16 pathways.
